In Chapter Five: *The Black South*, Talawa's American productions; *The Love Space Demands*, *From The Mississippi Delta and Flyin' West* point to the relevance of African American work to Talawa's audience. Chapter Six: *Stay in Your Box* illustrates Brewster's ground breaking work in the British classical genre. The productions discussed are: *Anthony and Cleopatra*, *King Lear*, *Tis Pity She's a Whore*, *The Importance of Being Earnest* and *Othello*. The book ends with Chapter Seven: *Don't Tell Massa*. Brewster and her work at Talawa are summed up, followed by an insight into her final attempt to secure a permanent home for black theatre in Britain.
